INTERNSHIP



CTE INTERNSHIP

A CTE Pathway Completer - A student that has completed all levels of a CTE Pathway that is seeking to apply field knowledge and skills.

PROFESSIONAL INTERNSHIP

A Professional Intern is a student that has not completed a CTE course sequence. This student currently has a paid job and is seeking school credit for their job placement.

**Both interns are required to comply with course requirements in order to obtain school credit.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

- Must be an upcoming senior, with a 2.8+ GPA.
- Complete Internship Application & 3 letters of recommendation
 - CTE Teacher Letter of Recommendation
 - Faculty Letter of Recommendation
 - Counselor Letter of Recommendation
- Attend all in-person class times. Refer to Appendix D for in-person dates.
- Complete all coursework assessments - reflective journals, timesheets, mentor evaluations, portfolio, and presentation.
- Agree to work 130 hours or more throughout the school year (65 per semester).
- Students are responsible for arranging transportation to and from the internship site.
