E-CIGARETTE VAPING, MARIJUANA VAPING & FENTANYL

- VAPING CAN BE USED TO SMOKE BOTH NICOTINE AND MARIJUANA/THC
- VAPES ARE BEING LACED WITH FENTANYL.
- MANY TEENS ARE PURCHASING THEIR PRODUCTS FROM SNAPCHAT/SOCIAL MEDIA AND ONLINE.
- E-CIGARETTES HEAT LIQUID MADE OF NICOTINE AND FLAVOR. THERE ARE OVER 15,000
- DIFFERENT VAPE FLAVORS
- VAPING CAN AFFECT THE BRAIN, HEART, AND LUNGS, REGULAR VAPE USE DISRUPTS
- THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE BRAIN'S STRUCTURE IN TEENS.
- IT TAKES VERY LITTLE FENTANYL TO CAUSE DEATH.
- FENTANYL IS OFTEN MIXED WITH OTHER OPIOIDS: PRESCRIPTION PAINKILLERS AND HEROIN.
- "RAINBOW FENTANYL" CAN RESEMBLE SMARTIES OR SKITTLES CANDY
- MARIJUANA HAS A HIGHER CONCENTRATION OF THC.





STATISTICS

- 51% of Arizona high school students have tried vaping at least once.
- Teens who vape are 4 times more likely to start smoking cigarettes.
- Teens who smoke cigarettes are 8 times more likely to use other drugs.
- Fentanyl is 50 x stronger than heroin.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- Finding unusual or unfamiliar items.
- Changes in behavior, mood swings, and agitation.
- An increase in shortness of breath.
- Increased thirst or dehydration.
- Nosebleeds and mouth sores.
- Caffeine sensitivity.
