Students participated as competitors in the SkillsUSA Championships, that were held on Wednesday, June 27th and Thursday June 28th. More than 7,500 students competed in over 100 occupational and leadership skill areas. SkillsUSA programs also help to establish industry standards for job skill training in the classroom.

Success comes from the Verrado Graphic Design program where six students received Silver Medals for their Career Pathways Showcase. One from Arts and Communication and the other for Business Management and Technology. Engineering had a fourth place for their showcase in Industrial Engineering. Also, Film and TV students placed eighth overall for Digital Cinema. Verrado had the largest amount of students attend with 13 students in five different competitions from the state of Arizona.
