If You are scheduled to take the PSAT/NMSQT test on Wednesday, October  $14^{th}$ . You need to arrive on campus no later than **7:45 AM**. This will allow time for you to find your testing location and for you to complete the mandatory health screening form. The exam will start promptly at <u>8:00 AM</u>. Students who arrive late, will not be allowed to test once the first section of the test has started. You need to make arrangements with your parents/guardians to drop you off and pick you up on time (7:45 AM – 12:00 PM).

## The PSAT/NMSQT is composed of the following sections:

60 minutes - Reading Test

35 minutes - Writing and Language Test

25 minutes - Math Test - No Calculator

45 minutes - Math Test - Calculator

Your testing room information will be posted under the library on Monday morning. If you are new to our campus, school staff will be available on test day to direct you to your testing room.

## What to Bring on Test Day

- MASK
- Two #2 pencils with soft erasers; no pens or mechanical pencils.
- Calculator you must provide your own
- Snacks and Drinks (must be stored under your desk during testing-can only be accessed during breaks)
- Sweater/jacket (classrooms can get chilly)

Study guides are available in the front office if you haven't picked one up yet. You can also find additional practice materials, including 2 full-length practice tests, on <a href="mailto:psat.org/practice">psat.org/practice</a>. The PSAT/NMSQT is the qualifying test for entry to the National Merit Scholarship Program. So, the better prepared you are, the better your chances to earn money for college.
