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B. Agua Fria High School will, with the assistance of its schools, provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training, and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:

- Holding regular informational meetings to train parents to facilitate student research capabilities.
- Holding Family workshops for parents
- Sharing District Curriculum Maps
- Training parents to access student grades via ParentVue

C. Agua Fria High School will, with the assistance of its schools and parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:

D. - Inviting parents to observe classrooms using the READ 180 and Ascend Math software.

E.
